SUMMARY: On July 25, 2025 the U.S. Department of Education published an intent to establish negotiated rulemaking committees in the Federal Register Page 35261, Column 1, 2, and 3; Page 35262, Column 1, 2, and 3; Page 35263, Column 1, 2, and 3; Page 35264, Column 1, 2, and 3 seeking public comment for the Public Hearing; Negotiated Rulemaking Committees; Department's intention to establish two negotiated rulemaking committees to prepare regulations for the Federal student financial assistance programs authorized under Title IV of the Higher Education Act (HEA) of 1965, as amended (Title IV, HEA programs). ED is requesting a correction to the Docket ID Number ED-2025-0151. Docket ID should read as ED-2025-OPE-0151.
