12	<b>Board of Trustees Comments:</b> The Board believes that due to the relationships between candidates for
13	elected office and the current officers of the association, that the Election Committee be the body that
14	oversees potential violations of the election code of conduct in order to promote fairness and remove
15	the potential for delegates to perceive bias. Therefore, the board recommends a yes vote.
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17	<b>Reference Committee Comments</b> : The Reference Committee recommends a yes vote.
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19	<b>Background:</b> Currently the officers of the association are charged with monitoring and evaluating
20	potential campaign violations. To remove any perception of bias, the officers should not be the ones
21	determining campaign violations. This should be reviewed by the Election Committee made up of the
22	secretary of the house, three members of the association and a member from a dental organization
23	other than ASDA.

25	Currently the only action to take if a campaign violation occurs is to remove the candidate from the
26 27	ballot. It is important to have other options for the Election Committee to consider when evaluating the severity of the campaign violation; therefore be it

29	RESOLUTION
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31 32	<b>Resolved,</b> that the Standing Rules of the House of Delegates, Section 7. Elections, B. Election Code of Conduct be amended to read as follows:
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34	B. Election Code of Conduct
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36	All Executive Committee and speaker of the House of Delegates candidates must agree to the
37	following guidelines before beginning their election campaigns. The intent of these guidelines is
38	to encourage fair campaigning by ASDA members and maintain dignified and courteous
39	conduct.

41	i. Candidates and their supporters shall not use ASDA central office stationery or business
42	cards issued by the central office to promote and support a candidate. However, the use
43	of the official ASDA logo on campaign materials is permitted.
44 45	ii. Candidates and their supporters should focus the campaign on positive attributes rather
45 46	than on negative characteristics of the opposing candidates. Candidates shall not, and
46 47	shall not cause or request their supporters to, make negative personal comments
47 48	against their opponents. iii. There shall be no packaged food, other gifts or campaign tokens distributed or used by
48 49	iii. There shall be no packaged food, other gifts or campaign tokens distributed or used by the candidates as part of the candidates' campaigns. These items include but are not

50	limited to badges, clothing, pins, and other small campaign tokens with the candidate's
51	name, signs, banners or printed material.
52	iv. Entertaining by the candidates will not be permitted in any suite or meeting room
53	reserved or funded by ASDA.
54	v. A candidate may solicit a delegate or alternate delegate by phone, mail, e-mail, social
55	media or fax. The ASDA central office will not provide any of this information.
56	vi. Candidates are only permitted to use their own personal funds for their campaign.
57	vii. Third party endorsements (such as corporate sponsors or other professional
58	organizations) are not allowed.
59	viii. Candidates must not loiter near ballot boxes during the specified voting time.
60	ix. Candidates are ineligible to be members of reference committees or awards committees
61	that convene at Annual Session.
62	In the event that the Board of Trustees adopts a resolution related to the candidacy of an
63	individual member seeking an Executive Committee or speaker of the house position, trustees
64	must provide the aforementioned resolution to their caucuses during the first caucus following
65	the board decision. The candidate must be informed of the resolution prior to the first caucus
66	meetings following the board decision so that the candidate may choose to address this issue
67	during the candidate's speech and/or caucus forums. The Executive Committee and Board of
68	Trustees may address the House of Delegates in regards to this issue if they deem it necessary.
69	
70	The Election Committee as outlined in Section 7 G. Election Committee officers of the
71	association shall be charged with the implementation and monitoring of these guidelines and
72	has the power to remove a candidate from the ballot. Upon receipt of a written complaint, or
73	upon initiation of a review of campaign-related material, the <b>Election Committee</b> officers shall
74	determine if a violation has occurred. If a violation has occurred, the <b>Election Committee can</b>
75	choose to take no action, request that the candidate discontinue their behavior, request that
76 77	the candidate discontinue their behavior and provide a report to the House of Delegates or
77	remove the candidate from the ballot and provide a report to the House of Delegates
78 70	president shall send written notification of the violation to the candidate. Any candidate so
79 80	adjudicated shall have an automatic right of an expedited appeal to the <b>Election Committee</b>
80	officers via electronic meeting or other timely means. If a violation has occurred, as determined
81 82	through this process, the candidate shall be deemed to have forfeited their status as a candidate
82 82	and may not be elected to office in the subsequent election. Any officer that is a candidate must declare a conflict of interest.

84 85	Each Executive Committee or enabler of the house condidate must be officially nominated by a
85 86	Each Executive Committee or speaker of the house candidate must be officially nominated by a
00	person of their choice at the House of Delegates Business Meeting II scheduled on Thursday

person of their choice at the House of Delegates Business Meeting II scheduled on Thursday 86 87 morning. An official candidate shall be formally nominated on the floor of the House of 88 Delegates. Candidates that did not meet the established application deadline may be nominated 89 after the nomination of official candidates. All candidates must be nominated by a predoctoral 90 member who is not a current or former national leader. Nomination is not required for 91 eligibility. Nominators will be allowed 1 minute maximum to nominate and introduce their 92 candidate, including a brief explanation of the candidate's experience and previous ASDA 93 positions held. Should there be fewer than three official candidates for the Executive Committee 94 or fewer than one official candidate for speaker of the house, it is the responsibility of the House 95 to nominate someone from the floor. Each Executive Committee and speaker of the house 96 candidate must also designate a guide who will serve as a neutral party and escort each 97 candidate through the caucuses. The guide will be responsible for monitoring the door and time. 98

Each candidate receives a copy of these guidelines and a statement to sign, certifying that they
have read the guidelines; promises to abide by them; will immediately report any deviations of
which they become aware to the Election Committee officers of the association; and will notify
and try to correct any supporter upon learning of an actual or potential deviation.
